15. Certificates of lawful development

Certificates of lawful development

At its meeting on 1 March 2012 the committee considered an application for a lawful development certificate for an existing use of the access and parking area at a property in Wantage. A number of councillors expressed concern that the committee was asked to consider such a legal matter without sight of all the evidence. Furthermore, some councillors expressed the view that officers had previously determined these applications.

This case highlighted that the delegated powers to the head of planning in the constitution require clarification to ensure that there is no doubt that they cover applications for certificates of lawful development. This matter will be addressed as part of the next constitution review. However, to avoid applications coming to committee prior to this review the committee is

invited to delegate authority to the head of planning to deal with applications.

Recommended: to authorise the head of planning to determine applications for certificates of lawful development.
