



## 4.0 Budget

4.1 The current budget position for this Committee for the year 2006/07 is as follows:

4.2 Since the last meeting of this Committee a grant of £500 has been awarded to Abingdon Band, under officer delegation and in consultation with the chair, towards the cost of the upkeep of the band room, the maintenance of instruments and purchasing a computer programme for music for training purposes. The £500 award has been deducted from the budget.

## 5.0 Twinning partnership grants (Service Level Agreements)

5.1 In accordance with the decision of the Executive at its meeting on 6 August 2004 (Minute Ex.83) twinning associations are partners in service provision and have signed a Service Level Agreement (SLA) to this effect. The funding for the SLA is allocated from Area Committee budgets. In the Abingdon Area the allocation is:

## Abingdon Town Council, £2,500 Drayton Twinning Society, £500

- 5.2 The twinning associations are asked to provide the following information as set out in their SLA:
  - a) A report of the programme for 2005/06, providing an evaluation of the events and activities, based on any surveys carried out and feedback received from participants, plus any suggestions for future activities to develop the link
  - b) An outline of any feedback from the wider community (non-members) on activities in 2005/06 and suggestions for future activities which might attract new people and groups
  - c) A programme for 2006/07 including activities which seek to broaden involvement in the twinning link by reaching out to new people and groups, especially young people
  - d) An outline of how the association's activities contribute to the Vale Community Strategy and how they benefit the communities served by the association
  - e) A copy of the annual accounts showing how the 2005/06 grant was spent
- 5.3 Following a discussion at a previous meeting of this Committee on twinning activities in Abingdon, the Town Clerk of Abingdon Town Council has accepted an invitation to provide the information requested in a verbal report to the Committee.
- 5.4 The Drayton Twinning Society has provided information on its activities in 2005/06. These focussed on the visit of 34 twinners from the twin town, Lesparre. Drayton villagers, clubs and other organisations were invited to participate in all the events to provide an opportunity for those who were not able to host to meet the visitors and join in. Although the response was disappointing for most events, the Barn Dance proved very popular. Other activities in 2005/06 revolved around fundraising.

The Society has provided an outline programme for 2006/07 which includes an Open Day in Drayton to publicise the twinning and attract new members.

5.5 Members are asked to note that the information provided does not meet all the requirements set out under Schedules 2 and 3 of the Service Level Agreement, but that further information has been sought and should be available to update Members verbally at the meeting.

5.6 The SLA grants totalling £3,000 have been allocated in the budget so do not have to be deducted from the remaining budget. Members are asked to decide if payment of the SLA grants can now be made to Abingdon Town Council and The Drayton Twinning Society.

## **Applicant: Abingdon Performance Arts Group (APAGE)**

Years in existence: 9 years

**Type of organisation:** Umbrella organisation for arts and crafts groups in Abingdon and surrounding area; it organises the Abingdon Arts Festival by co-ordinating and publicising the individual events, sponsoring specific events such as the opening and closing events, and introducing new, speculative events.

**Project or service details:** The Abingdon Performance Arts Group is seeking funding towards the production and distribution of the Abingdon Arts Festival 2007 programme of events. The festival will take place from 17-31 March 2007. The brochure is delivered to every household in Abingdon and the surrounding villages; it is also available to other parts of the Vale and Oxford City from central distribution points such as libraries, information centres and council offices.

The 2006 Festival comprised over 40 events ranging from the visual arts (art, photographic and sketchbook exhibitions), film, literature (story times and poetry sharing), music (brass band, jazz, classical, choral, popular), theatre and textiles (quilt exhibition).

The purpose of the brochure is to attract participants and audiences who would otherwise not be aware that the festival is for them. The continued wish of organisations to take part in the Festival and the success of events in attracting audiences shows that the Festival is meeting its aim of enhancing the cultural life of Abingdon and surrounding villages. The festival continues to grow and promotes a positive image of the district. The organisers are guided by the Vale Arts Development Officer to ensure that the festival reflects the cultural ambition of the Vale.

The 2007 festival will focus more on young people. The organisers are exploring how they can work in partnership with schools.

## Officer Comment (Abigail Brown, Arts Development Officer):

Abingdon Arts Festival delivers a valuable service to the arts and cultural groups in Abingdon by coordinating an annual programme of events and publicising it to nearly every resident in the town and surrounding area. This festival complements the arts programme with work that the Council doesn't have the capacity to deliver itself and fits in well with the Council's main aims and priorities of Town Centre and Village Vitality as well as the Social and Economic Agenda. The Arts Development aims of encouraging the voluntary arts community and encouraging access to a diverse range of arts activities.

They have an excellent track record of organising the festival for the past 7 years. It is run by volunteers who have proved to be more than capable of organising events, managing budgets and publicising the festival.
