M4: Where Door Supervisors are required when the premises is open for any licensable activity, they should all be individually registered with the Security Industry Authority.

# Mandatory Licensing Conditions in force from 6 April 2010

- 1. (1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
- (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children-

(a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to-

(i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or

(ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);

(b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);

(c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and

consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;

(d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on-

(i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or

(ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;

- (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
- 2. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 3. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

# Mandatory Licensing Conditions in force from 1 October 2010

- 4. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

5. The responsible person shall ensure that-

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures-

(i) beer or cider: ½ pint;

(ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and

(iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and

#### ANNEX 2: EMBEDDED RESTRICTIONS UNDER THE LICENSING ACT 1964

#### 1: Permitted hours - On-licences

Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied except during permitted hours.

In this condition, permitted hours means:

- a. On weekdays, other than Christmas Day, Good Friday or New Year's Eve, 11 a.m. to 11 p.m.
- b. On Sundays, other than Christmas Day or New Year's Eve, 12 noon to 10.30 p.m.
- c. On Good Friday, 12 noon to 10.30 p.m.
- d. On Christmas Day, 12 noon to 3 p.m. and 7 p.m. to 10.30 p.m.
- e. On New Year's Eve, except on a Sunday, 11 a.m. to 11 p.m.
- f. On New Year's Eve on a Sunday, 12 noon to 10.30 p.m.
- g. On New Year's Eve from the end of permitted hours on New Year's Eve to the start of permitted hours on the following day (or, if there are no permitted hours on the following day, midnight on 31st December).

The above restrictions do not prohibit:

- (a) the consumption of the alcohol on the premises during the first twenty minutes after the above hours;
- (b) the taking of the alcohol from the premises, (unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel,) during the first twenty minutes after the above hours;
- (c) the consumption of the alcohol on the premises by persons taking meals there during the first thirty minutes after the above hours, if the alcohol was supplied for consumption ancillary to those meals:
- (d) consumption of the alcohol on the premises by, or, the taking, sale or supply of alcohol to any person residing in the licensed premises;
- (e) the ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered:
- (f) the sale of alcohol to a trader or club for the purposes of the trade or club;
- (g) the sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's naval, military or air forces;
- (h) the taking of alcohol from the premises by a person residing there; or
- (i) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a person residing there who are bona fide entertained by him at his own expense, or the consumption of alcohol by persons so supplied; or
- (i) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the consumption of liquor so supplied, if the liquor is supplied at the expense of their employer or of the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.



We wish to record our objections to the variation above as follows:

1]Our location is 10 yards from the Guildhall car park; 13 yards to the bottle/recycling bins and only some 20 yards to the elevated walkway used by function attendees to cool off ,chat and smoke when the fire doors are opened for ventilation. Our bedroom is at the same level and directly opposite the walkway .In the summer our window is ,of course, open.

2]We understand that legitimate objections cover noise, hours of operation, vibration during the function and clear-up after the function . The present hours are acceptable but any extension, certainly on a Sunday or midweek, would not be;

A] Although the noise, when doors are shut, is acceptable, the structure of the building does transmit unwelcome base vibrations in step with the beat of the music in modern dance.

B] Some time must elapse after the function for clearance of the building and the greater noise occurs at this time as customers disperse. The additional noise of clean- up and car park clearance then occurs [in particular the noise of lots of bottles dumped in skips in early morning must offend against noise abatement rules]

C] Other local commercial hotel enterprises near the Guildhall, operate socially acceptable hours. They , of course, must care that their residents get a good night's rest.

We understand that there is confusion over the variation and that it might be a request for seven days a week. In consideration that no councilor has had the courtesy to inform us of the plan and that those same plans are even now somewhat obscure then we urge rejection and suggest that they apply on a case by case basis with an annual limit,

#### Proposed variation of licence: The Guildhall, Abingdon

We write to express our objections to the application currently before you, and to propose a compromise. The summary at the head of the application indicates that an extension is sought for both "licensable activities" and for the sale of alcohol on Friday and Saturday nights. However, the detail makes it clear that the extension is intended to apply to all seven days of the week. In view of this internal inconsistency, it seems surprising that the application should be considered without being referred back to the applicant for redrafting.

On the assumption that the Committee will consider the more extensive change, we would like to point out that we are immediate neighbours to the licensed premises, with windows barely 10 metres from the Guildhall, and that since ours is a listed property there is little that we can do by way of sound-proofing. We would therefore be deeply concerned if the licensing hours for the sale of alcohol were to be extended on a routine basis by two or two-and-a-half hours beyond those currently permitted. Given that the Abbey Meadow car park is one of the most convenient parking-places for events at the Guildhall, we are already affected by the noisy return to their cars of those attending evening events. It seems reasonable to object to this becoming a frequent occurrence at one o' clock in the morning.

We do recognize that the Guildhall is a valuable community facility, and that it needs to be commercially viable. There is, nonetheless, a balance to be struck between its promotion for entertainment and consideration for those who will be adversely affected as a result. Where we live in Abbey Close, we are already affected on occasion (particularly in the summer, when doors are open and more people are outside) by cumulative and significant noise from the Guildhall, the Crown and Thistle, the Abbey Buildings and those coming away from evening events at Cosener's House. As a result, we are vigorously opposed to the granting in full of the extension requested to the license at the Guildhall. We would be amenable to an extension on Friday and Saturday nights (sale of alcohol to 0030, "activities" until 0100) and to an extension for the sale of alcohol on Sundays until 2330 (instead of 2230 – "activities" however to cease at midnight in accordance with the existing licence). We note that the application asks for the sale of alcohol to terminate at the same time as the licensed "activities". This is a novelty and seems to us

inherently undesirable: it will be impractical to persuade people to leave the premises when you have just sold them another drink!

Finally, we would like to record our displeasure that we were not notified directly of the application. There is an increasing trend amongst local authorities away from the direct notification of those most immediately affected by a development or licensing application. They do not, in our opinion, thereby fulfil their public duty.

Dear Sirs,

I have read details of the proposed license variation with some concern and wish to make a number of comments which I would ask you to take into account when considering the application.

Firstly, I found the application form confusing, as in Part 3 of the form it is stated that "This is an application to amend/extend the current license so that all activities currently licensed until 00.00 on a Friday and Saturday night will be licensed until 01.00 the following morning. To extend the hours for the sale and consumption of Alcohol on and off the premises (currently until 23.00) until 01.00 the following morning on a Friday and Saturday night." However, Parts C to K and M all seek permission to extend the time limit for activities and the sale & consumption of alcohol until 01.00 on every day of the year. Having discussed the matter with your office, I understand that in case of a conflict between what is stated in Part 3 and Parts C to P it is the latter which are deemed to be the actual application.

Secondly, may I make the following comments about the application.

- a) the Guildhall is a much valued community asset, which I am sure all residents of Abingdon wish to see thrive as it continues to provide a much needed and welcome venue for large community events. However, I believe that due recognition has to be given to the fact that it is located in the most historic part of Abingdon the nearest dwelling is less that 10m from it. Many of the houses in its vicinity are very old and consequently do not benefit from modern building techniques or amenities such as double glazing and as they are listed would not be allowed to install such features. Thus they are more vulnerable to noise pollution.
- b) The operation of the Guildhall has always balanced the need to provide a venue for dances, concerts etc against the potential disturbance to the near neighbours. The previous owner (the VWHDC

itself) attempted to limit the sound (particularly in the Guildhall) electronically though such measures are occasionally by-passed by the users especially in summer months when the fire doors are opened to provide ventilation to the Hall. When events have been excessively loud neighbours have merely contacted the building's janitors and asked them to take the appropriate action, which has happened. Consequently very few formal complaints have needed to be lodged with the VWHDC environmental team.

- c) To extend the permitted hours for activities until 01.00 every day seems to me to be excessive in the extreme, and would cause significant public nuisance to the near neighbours in Abbey Close, Checker Walk and Thames Street not only from the events themselves but also as people leave and return to their cars the nearest car park is at the end of Abbey Close. Furthermore I have observed that often, as people leave the Guildhall, they stand outside chatting before going home. So an "end of event" time of 01.00 may mean disturbance to nearby residents until 01.30 or even later.
- d) Likewise, the wish to extend the alcohol hours until 01.00 every day is completely unacceptable I would have concerns about the resulting public safety, risk of an increase in drink-fuelled criminal damage, and nuisance to neighbours. (I am also puzzled why the alcohol hours match the event hours surely the alcohol hours should be 30 mins before an event ends)
- e) I would suggest that due notice should be given to that fact that there are other licensed premises in the vicinity in particular the Crown and Thistle Hotel, and the Abbey Buildings. If the application were to be granted, I would suggest that there is a great risk of "cumulative and prolonged" disturbance to the residents of both Abbey Close and Checker Walk.
- f) I would also ask why a public facility needs such long hours surely it would be more appropriate to increase the permitted hours to say midnight on Fridays and Saturdays and seek a special license for the rare occasions if/when a later licence can be justified. If the facility was being run as a commercial operation and was sited away from nearby residents then requested longer operating hours might be justifiable but is a community facility sited in the middle of a residential area.

Therefore, may I make the following suggestions – a) that on Friday and Saturday nights (and on any Sunday that precedes a Bank Holiday) "events" are permitted to continue until 00.00 and alcohol be permitted to be served until 23.30, b) that a condition is inserted in the licence requiring doors and windows to be kept shut during evening/night events (to prevent noise leakage), c) that the applicant is reminded that they are permitted to seek "special licences" for particular events, d) that the applicant is encouraged to discuss any proposed operational changes with the near neighbours of the Guildhall, d) that any variation of licensed hours granted is reviewed after the period of 1 year.

We have been made aware of the proposals to extend the licensing hours of the Guildhall until 1 o'clock in the morning seven days a week. Mr and Mrs Robert Dunsdon of 4 Checker Walk and Mrs Pat Atkins of 6 Checker Walk wish to express our objections to these proposals.

We understand that the Guildhall has to be run as a business, and that full use must be made of it. However, we believe that the proposed licensing hours would cause much distress to people living locally.

We already experience problems with late night revellers from the Crown and Thistle Hotel; ie loud and drunken arguments, bad language, car engines revving and car doors slamming. We are concerned that should the new licensing hours be granted we would further be subjected to loud music and the inevitable noise associated with the clearing-up process and the dispersal of people well after the 1 o'clock deadline.

We would be prepared to accept the proposed new hours if they were limited to Friday and Saturday nights, but we are absolutely opposed to these hours during the week. Mrs Atkins at 6 Checker Walk is in her eighties, and has trouble sleeping at the best of times. We at 4 Checker Walk are both still working and feel there is every possibility that our sleep would be affected should the proposals go through.


