>>> John Henville <john@henville.net> 18/01/2013 14:51 >>> We have recently seen notice of an application to vary the Premises Licence for the Thomas Hughes Memorial Hall. With some regret, we wish to lodge a response.

My wife and I live at Brockwood, The Green, Uffington some 140yds immediately to the north of the hall (see attached). The significance of this position is that there is nothing but light vegetation between our house (and particularly our bedroom) and the main door and car park of the hall. Even more significantly we are directly opposite the main hall's double fire doors which are routinely opened during events for ventilation and/or other purposes.

Because of this position we are exposed to any noise from the hall.

To date, such problems as we have experienced, have largely been limited to Friday and Saturday nights. These are the occasions when the hall hosts events involving a combination of amplified music, alcohol and full use of the time limits under the current license arrangements (typically parties, weddings, discos etc.). The nuisance on these occasions takes the form of extremely loud music through to 23.30 - midnight followed by noise associated with clearing up the hall (often exacerbated by the fire doors being opened for the disco/band to load vans etc) and noise generated by 'merry' departing guests (e.g. shouting, car doors/engines etc). We endeavour to be tolerant but we would be reluctant to see any increase.

Our concern is that altering the Premises Licence so as to increase the late night availability of alcohol in the hall on weekdays will increase the potential for noise nuisance of this kind. We accept that this may not be the current expectation of the licensee but circumstances (and licensees) do change. We do not hold an outright aversion to alcohol being available during the week <u>but</u> we would argue that an earlier cut-off than that requested in the application (say 22.00) would be both sufficient and appropriate.

For the record, we have no objection to the addition of film shows to the list of permitted functions.

Thanks also for the clarification. In fact, I think our understanding is in line with your summary except for the absence of reference (for reasons we understand) to the 12 TENS and the ability of any hirer to dispense alcohol without licence if it is not charged for.


Our fundamental issue with this, and any other licence application relating to the hall, is the noise we experience from late night entertainment held in that building. There is a clear correlation between this noise and the availability of alcohol and that is why this application in its current form causes us concern. Whilst the maximum number of events limit is not to be increased, the utilisation of that limit will be. If this results in midweek events running later as a consequence of alcohol being available, we will suffer additional nuisance. Moreover, this additional noise would arise during the working/school week rather than at the weekends when it is perhaps more easily tolerated.

We do accept that availability of alcohol will increase bookings during the week and thus improve the financial viability of the hall - a film club accompanied by a (profit making) bar could be very popular and we have no objection to that. What we do question is whether a village hall, located so close to residential properties, should have (or even need) a licence to sell alcohol up to 11.30pm during the working/school week.

You mentioned in your email the absence of previous complaints. We can't speak for other residents but it does seem to us that, given the construction of the hall, noise is more likely to escape through the sides (windows, doors, and sloping tile roofs) of the hall, rather than from double-skinned brick end walls. This alone would likely restrict the number of potential complainants. It is also the case, as far as our immediate neighbours are concerned, that their master bedrooms are located at the back of their properties whereas as ours is located at the front. I acknowledge that we haven't previously complained to the Vale about noise from the hall, but this is because we have deliberately tried to avoid do so for fear of prejudicing the viability of the hall. However, we have raised it as a concern. We have also complained to the Hall management as and when necessary. It is also the case that, come 11.45pm when heavy bass music is thumping/blaring, there is little point anyway in picking up the phone and trying to complain to the Vale. Once the event has finished, the nuisance has passed and cannot subsequently be monitored. Also, no two events are the same, nor is the wind direction or temperature, both of which can significantly influence the level of nuisance.

Still on the issue of complaining, we have previously suggested to the Hall that some form of noise control (automatic power cut-off above specified noise levels) and somehow discouraging use of fire doors for ventilation might mitigate the problem but, for various reasons, nothing could be/has been done.

Finally, as regards negotiation, we do believe there is scope for compromise (see previous email). Unfortunately we received the notice of the application some time into the consultation period and just before we were due to leave the country on holiday. Thus a formal response to the application was our only option within the available time frame. We certainly share your preference to avoid the need for a licensing panel if at all possible.

I acknowledge receipt of your e-mail in respect of the premises licence variation for the above premises.

I thought it would be worth spending a few moments clarifying a couple of things which you may or may not already know.

The premise licence currently in force permits the following activities to take place during the stated times:

Performance of plays, indoors sporting events, boxing or wrestling, performance of live music, playing of recorded music, performance of dance, anything of a similar description

Monday - Sunday 9am-Midnight

Sale of Alcohol

Thursday - Saturday Noon-11:30pm

Sunday Noon-6pm

The only part that is being varied is the addition of the sale of alcohol on Mondays-Wednesdays Noon-11:30pm.

I was also unsure if you were aware that the licence only permits the sales of alcohol up to a maximum of 25 days in a calendar year. This will not change.

According to our files there have not been any complaints made against the premises using their current licence. If problems were to occur in the future, they would be investigated and if substantiated, it would be possible to review the premises licence which may result in removing licensable activities or reducing the times in which they can take place.

As I said at the beginning of the e-mail, I just wanted to provide you with all relevant information. If after reading this, you still wish to lodge an objection and we cannot negotiate between parties, a licensing panel would need to be arranged (a panel of three councillors) so this variation application can be determined.

#### Dear Sirs.

It has come to my notice that the Uffington Village Hall Committee, in the person of Mr. Paul Armishaw, are again attempting to extend the licensing agreement in respect of the sale of alcohol. We have been there before, and I therefore, once again find it necessary to give you notice of objection. On the last occasion it was necessary for us to attend a committee meeting in Abingdon in person to achieve amicable settlement. I do hope we do not have to do so again.

I live directly opposite the hall, across the green in Style Cottage, Upper Common Lane, and am affected directly by the noise that comes from late night social events, when alcohol is sold, particularly in the summer months, when the wide fire escapes are left open for ventilation.

I see from the application that there are two aspects. One of the requests is to allow the showing of films. The other is to request an extension of permission for the sale of alcohol from 4 to 7 nights per week. This objection relates solely to the mid-week sale of alcohol. I have no objection to the proposed showing of films. Indeed, I do not wish to object to the sale of alcohol midweek per se. The requested timing is, however, unreasonable within the context of a hall centred in a small guiet village.

If alcohol is sold until 11.30 pm, the consumption and related social activities continue beyond that time. After that, there is the general noise of people leaving the hall, with slamming of car doors etc, and the sounds related to the general clear up before departure, as required under the terms of hire. This, as you might well imagine, goes on until well after midnight.

I understand that the application does not extend the total number of permitted events, but seeks to spread them over 7 days per week, rather the "extended weekend" as present allowed. During the working week, when people are have to be up early for work and school, I submit that this is unacceptable : people who choose to live in a small village should be allowed proper, undisturbed sleep. We are not a town.

There is a Public House in the village and a Sports Club (located so as to not be a noise nuisance) both licensed to sell alcohol all week.




