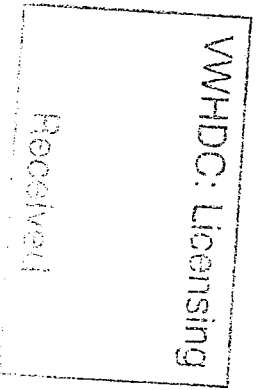

- (a) at a time when there is no Designated Premises Supervisor in respect of the Premises Licence, or
- (b) at a time when the Designated Premises Supervisor does not hold a Personal Licence or his Personal Licence is suspended.

Every supply of alcohol under the Premises Licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a Personal Licence.

Where Door Supervisors are required when the premises is open for any licensable activity, they should all be individually registered with the Security Industry Authority.

### Mandatory Licensing Conditions in force from 6 April 2010

1. (1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
  - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children:
    - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to:
      - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
      - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
    - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
    - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
    - (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on:
      - (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
      - (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
    - (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
  2. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
  3. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- Mandatory Licensing Conditions in force from 1 October 2010**
4. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
  - (2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures-

- (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
  - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
  - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
- (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

**ANNEX 2: EMBEDDED RESTRICTIONS UNDER THE LICENSING ACT 1964**

**Permitted hours - On-licences**

Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied except during permitted hours.

The above restrictions do not prohibit:

- (a) the consumption of the alcohol on the premises during the first twenty minutes after the above hours;
- (b) the taking of the alcohol from the premises, (unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel,) during the first twenty minutes after the above hours;
- (c) the consumption of the alcohol on the premises by persons taking meals there during the first thirty minutes after the above hours, if the alcohol was supplied for consumption ancillary to those meals;
- (d) consumption of the alcohol on the premises by, or, the taking, sale or supply of alcohol to any person residing in the licensed premises;
- (e) the ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered;
- (f) the sale of alcohol to a trader or club for the purposes of the trade or club;

Noise pollution - there is a lot of noise coming from the customers of the pub smoking outside the front of the black swan. As well as loud music which comes from the blue boar every Friday and Saturday which I can hear in my flat across the road from the blue boar. If the black swan was granted permission it would be made impossible for me and my partner to sleep at night as I can see they don't have any basic noise reduction facilities.

I wish to register strongly my wife and I's concern about the proposed extension of the licensing hours for the above pub. Since the end consultation date is tomorrow I trust you will honour this and take these comments into consideration,.

We live at the Stratton Way end of Park Road and generally speaking it is a pleasant and peaceful area to live and that is one of the reasons we bought our property nearly three years ago.

In the period we've been here, this has on numerous occasions been punctuated in the early hours of the morning by drunken antisocial revellers leaving either the Grapes, possibly The Black Swan when it was active and definitely Stratton's nightclub. Since the merciful closure of Stratton's it has improved but we are still often woken by screaming and shouting outside either the bus stop in Stratton Way or in Park Road by drunken imbeciles with no regard for other peoples' need to sleep. There are of course in the main no consequences for them because funding the forces of law and order seem to have been given such a low priority that one could be forgiven for believing this is now, more or less tacitly accepted as tolerable behaviour. There are however real consequences for those living in the path of the resulting melee:

- Broken sleep for working people or for that matter anyone in proximity and higher

levels of anxiety and stress resulting from this and the below

- Urination and sometimes worse (last year someone even defecated outside our house) from those making their way down Park Road
- Occasional acts of vandalism. Our car was damaged two years ago one evening for which we have had to pay an increased insurance premium for, once they knew what happened and earlier this year our neighbours in their seventies and eighties had a huge phallus painted into the pavement outside their house. The 85 year old man next door ended up cleaning it himself with white spirit before I had a chance to do it.
- Detritus left which we the residents end up having to remove the following day, - empty Styrofoam kebab containers from the likes of Sammy's, bottles sometimes broken etc.

I moved from a quieter South West London three years ago expecting to live in a pleasant market town to be frankly staggered at how little support is provided by the local authority in deterring petty crime and antisocial behaviour. Despite attempts to regenerate the town centre, it wallows more and more in its own rubbish with very few seeming to care.

Community policing is rarer than it was a couple of years ago and attempts at cleaning the town are hopeless. Last week I saw a contractor only pick up half the rubbish on the square, completely ignoring lumps of bread strewn about and Costa Coffee napkins billowing in the wind before returning to his white jeep, having a cigarette and then leaving. So utterly depressing.

I digress here I know, but this all has to be seen in the wider context. From where we are it sometimes seems like the 'night time economy' is the only game in town with little consideration given to people's basic right to have a decent night's sleep and not wake up worrying about whether their car has been vandalised, urinated on or when they step beyond their garden gate, they won't be stepping into vomit, broken glass and half finished takeaways.

Is this the kind of town you want to encourage? Do you honestly think that extending the licensing hours of the Black Swan until two in the morning won't have any bearing on the already unacceptable levels of nocturnal anti social behaviour in Abingdon? I accept that not everyone who wants to see live music until 2 in the morning behaves like this but some do, fuelled by alcohol. We are witness to it, time and time again and getting sick of it.

Do any of you who grant these licenses live in proximity to such places? Abingdon has residential areas in close proximity to the town centre so this has very real consequences to those living nearby.

I ask you to think very carefully at not just the possible benefits to the 'night time economy', i.e. The White Horse and some of the town centre's junk food outlets but the unaccounted costs borne out not only from the points above, but also in financing the policing of this.

I am writing to object to the recent application made by the Black Swan in Abingdon for an extended licence until 03:00 am on Thursday/Friday/Saturday evenings.

I have noted an improvement in late night anti-social behaviour since Stratton's nightclub was closed and to my mind allowing later opening hours elsewhere will increase the risk of this kind of trouble from starting again.

It seems to me that a 02:00 am licence is more than adequate in a market town. The amount of tax-payers money spent having to police anti-social activities that result from late night over indulgence is criminal when so many other public services are being cut.

To illustrate my concern, we have had numerous incidences of cars being damaged, neighbours chased and intimidated, public urination and noise - all late at night - in our part of town, Albert Park. I am aware that Black Swan public house has submitted a licensing application that will allow them to remain open and sell alcohol until 2am and on occasions 3am. This is clearly not in the interests of the residents of Abingdon.

The prospect of disturbances during the early hours of the morning from drunken revelers, as occasionally occurs presently around mid-night, is a matter for very serious concern and I wish to raise strong objections.

The residents of Abingdon have a right to quiet enjoyment of their properties and whilst some noise will inevitably be generated by passing traffic and neighbours, it is very unlikely that this fundamental right will continue if groups of inebriated youths disperse from the town center at 2 and 3 am. Voices are often inappropriately loud, behavior boisterous and language colorful at best.

Please do not agree to this request. It is difficult to imagine a request that would cause greater benefit to so few, to the detriment of so many.

Many areas of the town are already subject to noise pollution during the late evening, any extension of this into the early hours of the morning is totally unacceptable and it is important that the district council fulfill it's role of acting in the best interests of the residents of the town.
