Project or service details: The Abingdon Performance Arts Group is seeking funding towards the production and distribution of the Abingdon Arts Festival 2007 programme of events. The festival will take place from 17-31 March 2007. The brochure is delivered to every household in Abingdon and the surrounding villages; it is also available to other parts of the Vale and Oxford City from central distribution points such as libraries, information centres and council offices.

The 2006 Festival comprised over 40 events ranging from the visual arts (art, photographic and sketchbook exhibitions), film, literature (story times and poetry sharing), music (brass band, jazz, classical, choral, popular), theatre and textiles (quilt exhibition).

The purpose of the brochure is to attract participants and audiences who would otherwise not be aware that the festival is for them. The continued wish of organisations to take part in the Festival and the success of events in attracting audiences shows that the Festival is meeting its aim of enhancing the cultural life of Abingdon and surrounding villages. The festival continues to grow and promotes a positive image of the district. The organisers are guided by the Vale Arts Development Officer to ensure that the festival reflects the cultural ambition of the Vale.

The 2007 festival will focus more on young people. The organisers are exploring how they can work in partnership with schools.
