The smaller ward is voted for in Grove Methodists Church which is literally around the corner from the Old Mill Hall with parking in Millbrook Square or in front of the Church itself on Main Street. Years ago all the voting in Grove was done in the Old Mill Hall." | The designation of an additional polling place at Grove Methodist Church addressed problems with queues and provides a better location for voter convenience. |

However, the old Baptist Hall is very inconvenient. The access for cars is poor, being in the middle of double bends on A415, and foot access is also limited due to the absence of a pavement to the west. The school would have been a better option, the pub or Denman College possibly." (b) "Use of the Baptist hall in Marcham for the last elections was not great. There is no footpath from the centre of the village to the hall, only from Howard Cornish Road. Although there is a car park, the situation of the hall on the busy bends of the A415 make it difficult to enter/exit safely." | Officers will revisit the designation of the Baptist Hall as an alternative polling place for future elections. |

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| <p>Cumnor Village Hall, 1 Leys Road, Cumnor, OX2 9QS</p> | <p>(a) "re Cumnor boundaries and Cumnor polling places 1. Currently the boundary between the Cumnor Village and Cumnor Hill is the A420: while this looks convenient, if it were necessary to make changes to rebalance the number of electors in different polling districts, I would suggest the moving Oxford Road, Bertie Road, Norreys Road and Chawley Lane into Cumnor Village would be well understood by those of us living here. However, if no change is needed then we are familiar with the current boundaries. 2. The current polling place is usually the Cumnor Village Hall, which is on the edge of Cumnor Village. My view is that Cumnor Old School would be a more convenient location. I think it is sensible NOT to use Cumnor School so as to avoid the children of the local school losing a day's education. "</p> | <p>The current polling districts reflect the parish warding arrangements and are therefore logical for electors and officers. The council is reluctant to use schools as polling places due to the inconvenience to pupils and parents. The current polling place is well known to electors. Officers will investigate the designation of Cumnor Old School as a possible back-up.</p> |
