		Regulations ¹ published alongside the Framework stipulate public consultation as part of the process of local plan preparation, both in its formative stages and when the local plan is submitted in final form to the Secretary of State for independent examination. The Framework ² requires 'early and meaningful engagement and collaboration'. Public consultation at draft plan stage allows those potentially affected by the plan to comment, and their views to be duly considered in the preparation of the next stage of the document.
