Decision	To award the support contract for families accommodated under the UK Resettlement Scheme (UKRS) to Connection Support. The contract will be fully funded by central Government from funding available under UKRS.	
Reasons for decision	<ul> <li>On the 4 October 2019 Vale of White Horse District Cabinet pledged to resettle three families under UKRS.</li> <li>The government temporarily paused the scheme due to Covid19 however it is now operational again.</li> <li>UKRS resettles vulnerable refugee families in the UK.</li> <li>The families will require specialist support to help them settle successfully in South Oxfordshire.</li> <li>The specialist support is best provided by organisations with experience of supporting refugee families in the UK.</li> <li>In accordance with Contract Procedure Rules, an open invitation to tender for the contract was issued via the South East Business portal.</li> <li>Three tender submissions were received.</li> <li>Officers evaluated the tender submissions and evaluated on a 60 per cent price and 40 per cent quality award criteria basis.</li> </ul>
