	i) An update of the 2015 Oxford Green Belt Study to take account of			
	the Green Belt parcels removed in South Oxfordshire and Vale of			
	White Horse since that study was completed. This review should			
	also draw upon information identified in the Landscape Character			
	Assessment and other council studies to summarise what			
	beneficial uses the Green Belt could be put to.			
	ii) Consider whether exceptional circumstances exist to add areas of			
	land to the Green Belt.			
Reasons for	A competitive procurement process was undertaken using the ESPO			
decision	framework 664_21 Lot 8b. 51 companies were invited to tender. This			
	resulted in two tenders being received. This is less than the three			
	quotations required by the councils' procurement rules. However, soft-			
	market testing was undertaken with a range of companies prior to			

undertaking the procurement process and the tenders received were within the range of approximate quotations received through that exercise. The soft-market testing exercise also identified that there are a limited number of companies with sufficient resources and expertise to undertake all elements of the work.

The two tenders received were assessed based on price (40%) and quality (60%). Following a thorough evaluation process, LUC was found to offer best value for money.

Alternative options rejected

The alternative option was to go to open tender to obtain at least three quotations. This was discounted as the soft-market testing found that there were a limited number of companies that could undertake all the assessments required under a single contract, rather than having multiple contracts. It is considered beneficial to have all the assessments produced under a single contract given the interrelationships between the assessments, the need for consistency across the suite of landscape evidence, and the benefits this offers in terms of time and cost savings.

Climate and ecological implications

A number of questions were asked as part of the quality assessment, one of which asked the prospective suppliers to provide details of any actions their company is currently undertaking to reduce carbon emissions, including any waste reduction or environmentally friendly initiatives that the company follows. The answers to this question formed part of the consideration process.

Legal implications

It will be a Joint Councils contract in the name of both South Oxfordshire and Vale of White Horse District Councils.

The contract will be based on the ESPO framework standard terms and conditions.

It is anticipated that the contract will be signed and work will begin in January 2023.

Financial implications

The total contract value will be £252,220.00. This will be covered from the Joint Local Plan budget for the 2022-23 and 2023-24 financial years. There will be a 50/50 split between South Oxfordshire District Council and Vale of White Horse District Council (with a single purchase order raised by SODC and recharged to VOWH).

LUC's tender submission outlined a potential 'optional extra' in the form of additional field work to inform the Dark Skies/Light Impact Assessment. This would involve a specialist sub-contractor using a pioneering approach to take light meter readings across the districts. If this were to be taken forward, it could result in additional costs to councils of up to £55,000.00, depending on the extent of field work undertaken.
