Decision (Keep this succinct)	For the Head of Development and Corporate Landlord to approve entering a Joint Contracts Tribunal (JCT) Design and Build refurbishment contract with Danfo (UK) Ltd for the refurbishment works at the public toilets in Portway car park (Wantage) and the disabled toilet at the Charter car park (Abingdon).

Delegated authority reference from the constitution	Procurement Rules (page 241) within the constitution states that as the spend is over £75,000 the acceptance of the tender is by the head of service in consultation with the cabinet member and the contract can be signed by the head of service.		
Risks	Officers have worked with the same contractor on a similar public toilet renovation project which was successful so therefore consider the risk of poor quality and workmanship low.		
	A financial risk assessment has been carried out to establish if a bond is required and it is not considered to be a requirement for this contract. The risk assessment will be submitted for approval by the Head of Finance and Head of Legal and Democratic in accordance with Contract Procurement regulations para 3.47.		
Reasons for decision	Officers have followed the procurement process to identify a suitable supplier to undertake the refurbishment of the public toilets in the Portway car park Wantage and the refurbishment works to the disabled toilet in the Charter car park, Abingdon.		
	In conjunction with the Procurement officer, it was determined that the most appropriate contract for the refurbishment works at both Portway and Charter toilets was a single 'JCT design and build contract', to allow for the best value for money to be achieved.		
	Tender and Evaluation The contract presurement was an energy tender on the court part.		
	The contract procurement was an open tender on the southeast		

business portal. Unfortunately following the tender period and interest from a number of contractors, only one contractor submitted a bid to undertake the works.

Officers have evaluated and approved the one tender submitted for each of the projects.

The quality return was extremally good and individual evaluation scores were amalgamated which resulted in a quality score of 94 percent. The prices received from Danfo are broken down in the financial implications section of this notice.

The recommendation is to award the contract to Danfo (UK) Ltd.

This company recently completed works to refurbish the toilets at Grey's Road car park in Henley for South Oxfordshire District Council and undertook the work in a professional manner. Officers consider that the price supplied to undertake the works on both facilities is value for money for the council and will meet the requirements of the specification.

The proposed layout design for the finished building at Portway is included as Appendix A to this report. We are taking the opportunity to provide cubicles that are directly accessed from the outside instead of communal areas to improve the safety of the toilets.

The proposed layout design for the Charter public toilet is identified later in this report.

Alternative options rejected

Both toilet facilities are in busy towns with a significant usage of the facilities. The condition of the toilets no longer provides the standard of facility expected. The alternative of do nothing is therefore not recommended.

As only one bid was received, officers did consider retendering the works, but the delay could lead to the loss of the grant from the Department for Levelling Up, Housing & Communities and as Danfo is a recognised supplier of Changing Places (CP) facilities it was not considered that better value for money would be achieved.

Climate and ecological implications

Within the specifications for the Portway toilet, contractors were asked to provide ideas and costs for additional equipment that could be installed to reduce the carbon usage in operating the toilets in the future. Further discussion with the contractor and the corporate energy officer will take place following the award of the contract as to which of these options would provide the best cost benefit.

The options and costs that will be discussed further within the Portway contract are shown below

One standard JCT Design and Build Contract with Quantities covering the works at both locations, will be amended by legal, to be signed by both parties following authorisation to award the contract to Danfo Ltd.

Budget provision, Portway Refurbishment

A grant from the Department for Levelling Up, Housing & Communities for the installation of the CP facility.	£100,000
Wantage Town Council	£12,000
Vale CIL funding	£45,000
Capital funding from YA50	£66,265

Note the grant from the Department for Levelling Up, Housing & Communities will not be paid until the facility is open and the location is on Changing Places website, which means that the council will have to provide the forward funding for the works to be undertaken and then repay the grant into the capital code.

Expenditure Charter Car Park Disabled Toilet

The refurbishment works to the disabled toilet in the Charter Car Park, Abingdon totals £37,718, with no optional extras. The facility would then be open to all users.

Budget provision

Charter Car Park disabled toilet refurbishment will be funded from YA50 at a tendered cost of £37,718.

(YA50 currently balance is £147,000, this will be reduced to £43,017 if all the above works are undertaken).

It is proposed to make a 20p charge for the use of the toilets, which will be through a swipe card. Disabled users will still have free access to the toilets using a radar key. This charge is the same as already chargers to use the toilets in Hales Meadows (Abingdon and Grove). This income is estimated to be around £200 per annum.

Other implications

Portway Toilet, Wantage

Consideration has been given to the allocation of the toilets between male / female and unisex to ensure we meet current legislation. Within the likely design there will be one male toilet, one female toilet, one unisex toilet, a unisex ambulant toilet with baby changing facility and the unisex CP toilet.

Externally, the toilet block will retain its existing finish although the soffits and gutters will be replaced in plastic. External doors will be made from metal and be green in colour.

Internally, the appearance of the Danfo in-built modules are clean and hygienic as shown in example below.



Toilet pans are wall-mounted to aid cleaning of the floors and removing silicone that can harbour germs and dirt and are manufactured out of stainless steel for strength and ease of cleaning.

Handwash unit is integrated into the wall and manufactured out of stainless steel. We provide stainless steel mirrors and easy-clean neutral-coloured walls with tiled floors.

All internal fittings such as ventilation, hand washing, and lighting will only operate when the toilets are occupied, and the toilet flush will automatically operate again when the toilet door is opened for the customer to exit.

The toilets will have a time lock mechanism installed to allow the toilet to be closed overnight if required in the future.

The works will require building control approval which is included within the contract as the contractor's responsibility.

Charter Disabled Toilet, Abingdon


The refurbishment will include the following works and the toilet will then be open to all users:-

- Wallgate accessible handwash unit
- Wallgate floor standing composite toilet bowl Disable Discrimination Act (DDA) compliant
- "Wave-on" flush system with cistern in the service area
- Steel door powder coated in Green
- RADAR & Contactless access system with built in timer for opening & closing
- White rock walls
- Tiled floors
- LED lighting including emergency via microwave sensor
- Mechanical extraction via PIR with over-run
- Stainless steel paper dispenser
- Full Length stainless steel polished mirror
- 2 X Coat hooks
- Baby changing table

	Access			
	Access to the toilet would be via contactless card payment or RADAR key. Currently there is no cost to use the toilets but they have been continuously vandalised so it is considered that a small charge will make them less of a target for future vandalism. The system has a built-in programmer to open and shut the toilets at predetermined times.			
	The contactless card reader takes payment from debit, credit, Apple pay, Android and Monyx cards.			
	All payments received would be paid directly to Vale Council from NAYAX, a supplier and account handling company who works with Danfo.			
	Contactless unit will be installed by Danfo and then operated direct by Council. Charges will be approximately £10 per month for each unit plus 2.95 percent of charges for transactions.			
	The works will require building control approval which is included within the contract as the contractor's responsibility.

IMPORTANT NOTES TO OFFICERS:
