Decision	To create a budget for £24,999 from S106 contributions to fund a Vale of White Horse District Council project, towards the installation of artistic paving at the Portway, Wantage which will form part of the Portway Rain Garden Project. To release the funds, as set out below and transfer them to a budget code set up for this purpose.		
Reasons for decision	We have received a request for funds from the councils Arts Development Officer for a total of £24,999 from a S106 contribution (15V38) arising from the development at Land west of Stockham Farmhouse, Wantage. The S106 agreement is not 'clear and unambiguous' about how the contributions are to be used and the sum requested is more than £20,000, but below £100,000. Thus, in accordance with our constitution, the relevant Cabinet Member in consultation with the Cabinet Member for Finance can agree to set up a budget and release the funds requested for the project described above. The S106 agreement was secured and we have received £28,201.34 towards the cost of selection, provision and associated costs of the Work of Art to be installed by the Council on or in the Vicinity of the Development. Vicinity is defined as within five miles of the Development. The proposed project forms an element of artistic paving to enhance		

the wider Portway Rain Garden Project. The wider project implements Sustainable Urban Drainage Schemes (SUDS) to reduce surface water ingress into the Thames Water drainage network, intending to reduce the pressure on the mains sewage system and is to receive funding from Thames Water and from allocated CIL funding. The artistic paving is one of three artistic elements which will enhance and contribute to the wider rain garden project. It is anticipated that the further two artistic elements (wall art and artistic benches) will seek S106 funding from public art contributions at a later date. The total project cost for the installation of artistic paving is £24,999 which can be funded from the S106 secured contribution of £28,201.34. The remaining balance of £3,202.34 can fund other public art projects in accordance with the terms of the S106

The council's Legal, Finance, Climate and biodiversity, Diversity and equality, Risk and insurance, Communications, Community enablement, Planning, Community safety and Strategic property teams have been consulted and have raised no objections to the proposed project and use of the S106 contributions.

Wantage Town Council have been notified of the project and application for S106 funding and have made no comment.
